Last week, President Trump said he would impose a 25% tariff on steel imports and 10% on aluminum, triggering a drop in the stock market and fears of a broader trade war. The proposed import tariffs follow the recommendations of the Department of Commerce in a national security investigation under Section 232 of the Trade Act of 1962. These import tariffs will be the first time import duties are imposed under this obscure trade law.
