Britain will on Wednesday push G7 allies to get tough on China over "pernicious practices" that undermine the international trading system, calling for an overhaul of outdated and ineffective World Trade Organization rules.

United States Trade Representative Katherine Tai today announced the suspension of all U.S. engagement with Burma under the 2013 Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA), effective immediately. This suspension will remain in effect until the return of a democratically elected government.

American Association of Port Authorities Praises Infrastructure Bill The American Association of Port Authorities said that \$17 billion dedicated to ports is "a substantial down payment on the \$29 billion in federal investments necessary to modernizing our ports and ensuring that our trade infrastructure remains strong." It said that more than a quarter of U.S. GDP is connected to imports and exports through the seaports.
