# **Government Actions and Trade**

**CBP Allows for Release of Non-Cotton Goods From Second Detained Unique Shipment** 

CBP allowed for the release of some styles of men's shirts imported by Uniqlo that were detained over the suspected use of cotton from the Xinjiang Production and Construction Corps in China because the shirts were not made of cotton, the agency said in a May 18 ruling.

#### Trilateral Statement of the USMCA Free Trade Agreement

During the FTC, the Ministers reviewed the work already underway to advance our cooperation under the Agreement. Despite the challenges and hardships of the COVID-19 pandemic, committees established by the Agreement have convened virtually since entry into force on July 1, 2020.

#### Why are Bills of Lading Issued in Sets of Three?

Original bills of lading are normally issued in identical sets of three. The master can act by delivering against the first original presented for delivery of the cargo. The practice is described in the phrase "the one of which being accomplished the others to stand void."

#### China Steps Up Efforts to Join Trade Pact Created to Exclude It

China is pushing ahead with behind-the-scenes talks to join a major trade deal that originally aimed to exclude Beijing and cement U.S. economic power and trade ties in the Asia-Pacific region.

#### EU, U.S. Reach Truce on Metal Tariffs Ahead of Biden Visit

The European Union agreed to avoid escalating its dispute with the U.S. over metal tariffs, sparing iconic products such as bourbon whiskey and Harley-Davidson motorbikes from a doubling of EU duties next month.

# ATSB: Fire on Self-Unloading Bulk Carrier Highlights Inadequate International Fire Safety Standards and Regulations

Investigators with the Australian Transport Safety Bureau said a five-day fire on board a self-unloading bulk carrier at the Port of Kembla in 2018 highlights the lack of adequate regulatory requirements and standards to address the known risk of fire on-board self-unloading ships.

#### Scores Missing from Barge as Cyclone Pummels Indian Coast

The Indian Navy mounted a massive air and sea rescue mission on Tuesday for 81 oil workers and crew whose barge sank in heavy seas following a powerful cyclone that tore up the west coast killing at least 29 people.

# 1 Dead, 8 Injured After Suspected Smuggling Boat Capsizes Off San Diego Coast

Lifeguards rescued 10 people in what the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department called "rough water conditions," including eight who were hospitalized. Some of the migrants wore life vests.

# CBP and NIKE, Inc. partner to prevent counterfeit shipments from entering the United States

Under its partnership with CBP, NIKE, Inc. is donating proprietary technology to aid in authenticating a variety of NIKE, Inc. merchandise and prevent counterfeit products from entering the United States.

# Ambassador Katherine Tai Applauds Enactment of the COVID-19 Hate Crimes Act


The bill addresses the increase in hate crimes against Asian American

#### **CBP Issues Harmonized System Update**

CBP created Harmonized System Update (HSU) 2105 on May 19, containing 414 Automated Broker Interface records and 83 Harmonized Tariff Schedule records, it said in a CSMS message.

Romney: US Must Join Allies to Confront Chinese Economic Abuses Sen. Mitt Romney, R-Utah, says there is the potential for a bipartisan consensus on a strategy to compete with China. Romney, who was speaking at a U.S. Chamber of Commerce program May 19, said the two parties are more united than they were two years ago, as they recognize China's threat to liberal democracies.

EU Focus: Blue Economy Targeting Marine Pollution and Ship Recycling The European Commission is calling for a new approach in developing a sustainable blue economy, telling all member states that they need to develop plans in 2021 addressing the maritime sector.

**U.S.** West Coast Ports Race to Clear Ship Backlog by Peak Season A total of 19 container ships were anchored waiting for entry into Los Angeles and Long Beach, California, as of Sunday, compared with 21 a week earlier, according to officials who monitor marine traffic in San Pedro Bay. The bottleneck has persisted since November, peaking around 40 vessels in early February.

Shipping Industry Unites in Effort to Stop Gulf of Guinea Piracy
To raise world attention on the threats to shipping in the Gulf of Guinea and
take the first steps to improve security, a task force of stakeholders from
across the shipping industry launched the Gulf of Guinea Declaration on the
Suppression of Piracy.

SRI: UN Seafarer's Rights Initiative Must Be Backed Up by Enforcement Seafarers' Rights International (SRI), the maritime legal research organization based in London, is warning that unscrupulous vessel operators could avoid compliance and attempt to undercut the competition if maritime human rights standards are not properly enforced.

A new SEC filing shows that the Scion Asset Management, the private investment firm founded and led by famed investor Dr. Michael Burry, purchased about \$10.5 million worth shipping stocks in the first quarter of 2020.

Secretary of State Blinken Criticizes Russia's 'Unlawful Maritime Claims' in the Arctic

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Tuesday criticized Russia's activities in the Arctic region, describing them as 'unlawful maritime claims' and repeated calls to avoid the militarisation of the region, days before a gathering of Arctic nations.

CMA CGM Marco Polo Becomes Biggest Ship to Dock on East Coast CMA CGM Marco Polo arrived at the Port of New York and New Jersey Thursday, becoming the largest ship to ever call on the U East Coast. The ship previously called in Halifax, marking its first stop and setting the North America east coast size record.

Project to Widen and Deepen Houston Ship Channel Breaks Ground

The Port of Houston has started construction on the project to widen and deepen the 52-mile Houston Ship Channel. The project, known Project 11, will widen the channel by 170 feet along the Galveston Bay reach, from 530 feet to 700 feet. It will also deepen upstream segments to 46.5 feet.

**U.S.** West Coast Ports Race to Clear Ship Backlog by Peak Season Ship congestion outside the busiest U.S. gateway for trade with Asia showed glimmers of easing as port officials race to clear a backlog of arriving cargo before peak season begins in about three months.

# US Warehouse Development Shifting from E-Commerce Back to Import Logisitics

After 10 consecutive months of record or near-record import volumes, and seaport-dependent supply chains struggling with congestion, developers this year are focusing on traditional warehouse and import distribution space.

#### **April Truck Tonnage Dip Belies Ongoing Demand**

The volume of freight handled under contract with motor carriers showed a month-over-month decline in April following a strong March.

#### **April Imports from Asia Down from March But Still Impressive**

Although US imports from Asia in April did not match the impressive volume recorded in March, it was nevertheless the busiest April on record and the 10th consecutive month of year-over-year import increases since last July.

#### **Amazon Makes Push to Reduce Worker Injuries**

The company said Monday that its new program, called WorkingWell, aims to better educate some of its employees on how to avoid workplace injuries and improve mental health on the job.
