Addressing Sanctions Risk in Maritime Trade

Global maritime shipping accounts for up to 90 percent of total international trade by volume and 70 percent by value. At the same time, the maritime industry is the key artery for sanctions evasion globally, a result of deceptive shipping practices used by bad actors.

US-China Economic Talks Put Spotlight on Yuan Exchange Rate as Currency Continues to Surge

The rapid appreciation of the yuan against the US dollar recently is likely to draw increased scrutiny from the Biden administration of China's opaque exchange rate mechanism, as high-level trade talks resume between the world's two biggest economies, analysts say.

China Customs Accuses Western Clothing Brands of Selling Substandard Products Amid Xinjiang Row

In a warning notice published on its website, China's General Administration of Customs listed 81 batches of imported children's clothing products for quality and safety risks spotted during examinations from June 2020 to May 2021, involving garments, toys, toothbrushes, shoes and baby bottles.

U.S. to Levy Tariffs Over Digital-Service Tax, but Suspend Implementation

U.S. trade representative Katherine Tai said investigations determined that tariffs were justified because of digital-services taxes imposed on U.S. companies by the U.K., Austria, India, Italy, Spain and Turkey.

U.K. to Begin Process to Join Trans-Pacific Trade Partnership

Japanese Economy Minister Yasutoshi Nishimura said the move would strengthen economic ties between the U.K. and Japan, as well as making the zone covered by the deal equal to the EU in terms of economic size.

UK Looks to Seal Australia Trade Deal After G7

UK international trade secretary Liz Truss said that the UK's plans would be presented to parliament before the formal start of negotiations.

Japan Likely to Defend Taiwan if Beijing Makes Moves, Former US National Security Official Matt Pottinger Says

Tokyo would step up militarily to defend Taiwan if Beijing moved to reunify the island with mainland China by force, former deputy national security adviser

Port of Long Beach Incentivizes Carriers to Deploy 'Greenest' Ships

The Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners earlier this month approved changes to the port's Green Ship Incentive Program, launched in 2012, that incorporate the international Environmental Ship Index (ESI). The ESI is a voluntary system that identifies seagoing ships exceeding the current emission standards of the International Maritime Organization.

Dominion Energy Reaches Deal on Charter of First Jones Act-Compliant Wind Turbine Installation Vessel

The vessel, named Charybdis, will be used to install Ørsted-Eversource's Revolution Wind and Sunrise Wind, two of the nation's first large-scale offshore wind farms subject to regulatory approval.

Houseboats Removed from Lake Oroville as Water Levels Drop Due to Drought (PHOTOS)

As of Wednesday, Lake Oroville was at 38% of capacity and 45% of the average early June water level. As water levels fall, the houseboats were at risk of getting stuck or sustaining damage. Many of the houseboats now sit in parking lots next to the lake.

Carbon Neutrality Goal: China is Leading Global Surge in Green Bond Financing This Year

Through May 27, China accounted for 13.4 per cent of all green bonds issued globally, raising US\$26.1 billion, according to data provider Refinitiv.

Biden Administration Supports Oil, Mining Projects Backed by Trump

Biden administration lawyers are defending oil and mining projects approved under the Trump administration, benefiting ConocoPhillips, Rio Tinto PLC, BHP GroupLtd.and others at the expense of environmental and tribal groups challenging the projects.

X-Press Pearl Partially Sinks Off Colombo – PHOTOS

The X-Press Pearl was loaded with 1,486 containers, including 25 tons of Nitric Acid and other chemicals. Sri Lankan officials fear the sinking of the vessel would impact local fisheries and create an environmental disaster along the shoreline. The government on Wednesday suspended fishing along a 50-mile stretch of the island's coastline, affecting 5,600 fishing boats.

Maersk Calls for Carbon Tax on Ship Fuel

A.P. Moller-Maersk A/S says such a levy would help bridge the price gap between fossil fuels that vessels consume today and greener alternatives that are currently much more expensive. Fuel costs would effectively almost double if the measure were imposed today because of how carbon dioxide emissions are counted.

CO2 Emissions from Coal Shipping Steady in 2020 as Green Pressures Grow

Research published on Wednesday by independent climate think tank Ember showed seaborne coal exports were estimated to account for 3.1 billion tons of CO2 produced in 2020, or some 10% of total energy-related CO2 emissions last year.

COCA-COLA Becomes First Global Implementation Partner to Help Accelerate Cleanup

Maritime

Container Ship Scores 'Off the Charts,'; 'Fantasy' Charter Rate: \$135,000/day

In a sign of just how frenzied the container market has become, a freight forwarder is reportedly paying \$135,000 per day for a short-term charter of the S Santiago, a 15-year-old container ship with a capacity of 5,060 twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs).

Your Climate Change Goals May Have a Maritime Shipping Problem

Maritime shipping is one of the few sectors left out of the language of the Paris Agreement on climate change. The industry currently accounts for a relatively small share of global CO2 emissions — between 2% and 3% according to S&P Global Platts Analytics — but some scientists have projected that maritime shipping could account for 17% of total annual CO2 emissions by 2050.

OFAC's Sanctions Advisory is Changing the Maritime Industry for Good

The guidance was the first to target the wider maritime industry, and it sought to make clear that the onus of responsibility for sanctions compliance lies with everyone across the supply chain, and stressed the need for the private sector to plug the many holes currently used to circumvent sanctions. The advisory became instantly pivotal for all those with exposure to maritime trade.

Biden Budget Pumps \$84 Million into Virginia Port Deepening

The project funding from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers was part of President Joe Biden's 2022 budget proposal released on Friday. The \$350 million project will deepen the port's channels to 55 feet and widen the channels to allow two-way traffic for ultra-large container ships and would make the Port of Virginia the deepest port on the U.S. East Coast.

FMC to Implement National Shipper Advisory Committee

The Committee was created as part of the William M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (H.R. 6395) to "advise the Federal Maritime Commission on policies relating to the competitiveness, reliability, integrity, and fairness of the international ocean freight delivery system."

Oakland Congestion Spurs Zim to Reroute Premium China Service to LA

Due to vessel delays in Oakland, Zim is suspending its premium trans-Pacific service until at least late July and is re-routing the service from Central China to call in Los Angeles-Long Beach.

Hong Kong silently and privately marks Tiananmen Square

In 1997 when Great Britain returned Hong Kong to China, the terms of the deal were that Hong Kong remain a Special Access Region with separate rights and rules than mainland China. Today, the passage of a National Security Law and arrests of demonstrators, newspaper owners and Hong Kong legislators has seen the United States and the global trade community change export control rules and even done away with "Made in Hong Kong" marking designations because Hong Kong's autonomy no longer exists. This year, the usual observations of what happened in 1989 in Tiananmen Square which have drawn tens of thousands to public spaces in Hong Kong were empty - chilled by the arrest of a pro-democracy activist and noticeable police presence focused on sending a message of deterrence.
