

Offshore Floating Solar Technology Receives World's First Class AiP

For the first time, a floating offshore solar technology has received an Approval in Principle (AiP) from one of the leading classification societies. According to Bureau Veritas which issued the approval to Dutch renewable energy company SolarDuck, this marks the beginning of a new era for this form of renewable energy.

#### Maersk Enters Agreement for 8 Methanol-powered Vessels

The vessels are expected to save around 1 million metric tons of CO2 emissions annually. The dual-fuel capability will make up 10%-15% of the total

cost of each vessel, according to Maersk, but it will also give the company more flexibility if fuel supply is limited.

The EPA is Banning Chlorpyrifos, a Pesticide Widely Used on Food Crops, after 14 Years of Pressure from Environmental and Labor Groups On Aug. 18, 2021, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency announced that it will end the use of chlorpyrifos – a pesticide associated with neurodevelopmental problems and impaired brain function in children – on all food products nationwide.

### Commercial Fishing Policies Need to be Improved for Sake of Marine Environment — ecoRI News

Commercial fishermen are employing techniques that have been used for decades. The lower large nets from the stern of their vessels. Some of these nets are well over 100 feet wide. They are lowered to tend bottom as the trawler moves slowly forward for anywhere from less than a mile to up to 10 miles, or until there is so much strain on the cables that the net must be raised to be emptied.

### Will Drones And Warships Be Enough To Tackle The World's Latest Piracy Hotspot?

By Libby George (Reuters) Helicopters hover above a patrol vessel in Nigeria's frenetic Apapa port as attack boats zoom past. On the dock, drones emblazoned with the Nigerian flag sit ready to deploy – all part of a \$195 million U.S.-backed "Deep Blue" initiative to deter pirate attacks in the world's most dangerous area for seafarers.

#### At Port of Los Angeles, More Boxes Leave Empty Than Loaded

Exports from the top ten US container ports slumped by 8.3% in July, compared with the same month of 2020, to 763,619 teu, while imports gained 14.3% to 2,096,076 teu, according to data from Blue Alpha Capital.

#### How Long Does it Take to Build a Shipping Container?

One indicator of just how quickly new boxes can be popped out: China's factories can theoretically work around the clock and add a second 12-hour shift, but haven't done so despite this year's historic demand. One reason they've kept to one shift (besides propping up container prices) involves customer preference.

### China Shipping: Container Disruptions Inevitable at Ningbo-Zhoushan Port, but Impact May Be 'Marginal'

As rumors swirl about a possible reopening time frame for a key terminal at the world's largest port by cargo tonnage, analysts and industry insiders say any problems in the global supply chain could be milder than those seen earlier this year at China's Yantian Port in Shenzhen.

#### China Bulker Pileup Dwarfs California Container-ship Gridlock


